I am writing to apply for the ByrneWallace traineeship. My interest to pursue a career in law developed over time. They included me in their meetings and helped me to develop my legal skills by relying on me for various research projects. It was through the Managing Partner of the Brussels office, Izzet Sinan, that I was first brought in contact with ByrneWalace. Mr Sinan had a very high regard for Joanne Finn's work and kindly put me in touch with her.
